Trembling Before G-d shatters assumptions about faith, sexuality, and religious fundamentalism. Built around intimately-told personal stories of Hasidic and Orthodox Jews who are gay or lesbian, the film portrays a group of people who face a profound dilemma – how to reconcile their passionate love of Judaism and the Divine with the drastic Biblical prohibitions that forbid homosexuality.

In the film we meet a range of complex individuals including: Rabbi Steven Greenberg, the first openly gay Orthodox rabbi; closeted, Hasidic gays and lesbians in 'straight' marriages; Orthodox lesbian high-school sweethearts; and individuals abandoned by their religious families. Trembling is more than a film; it's become a movement.
