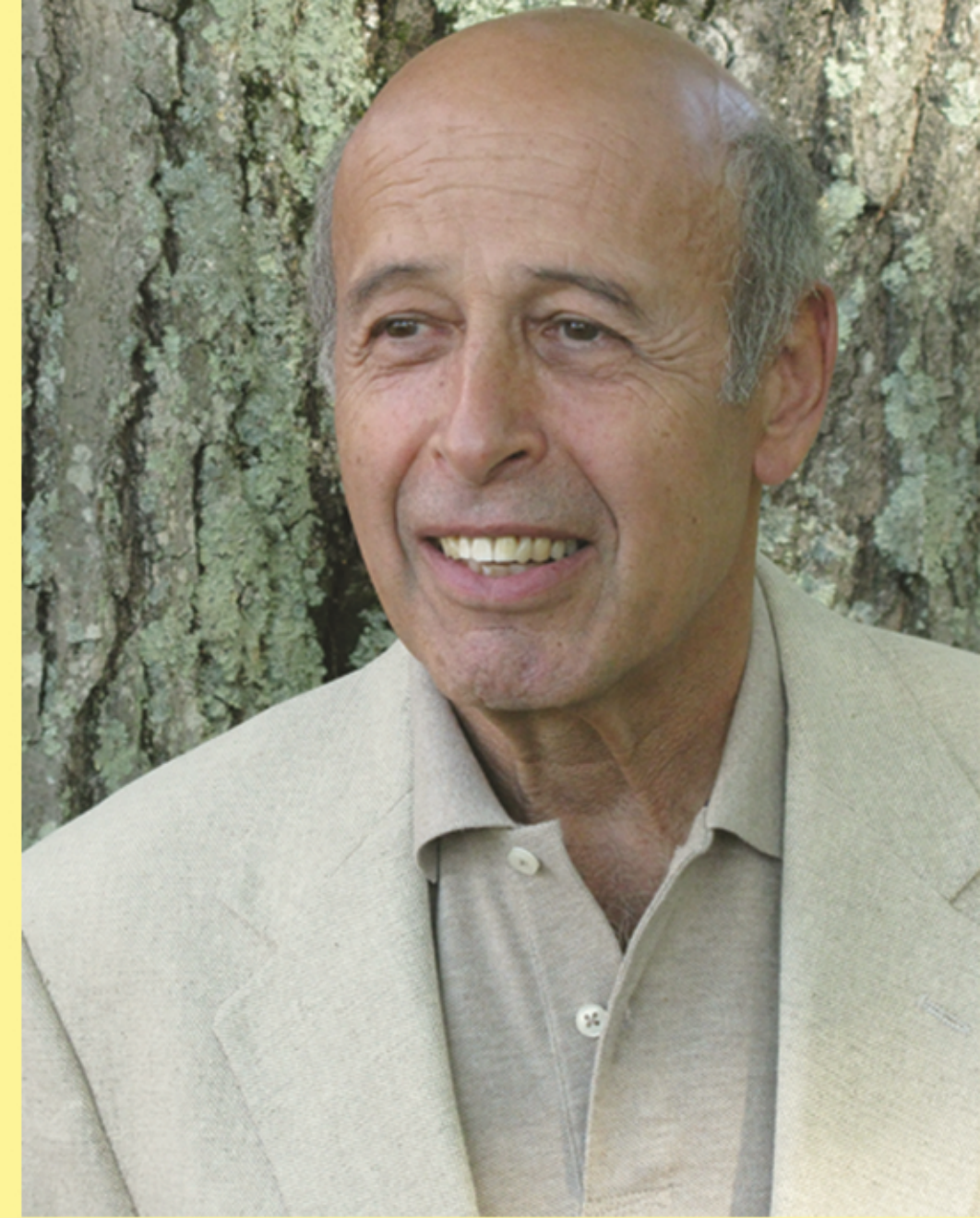


**EVIL AND GOODNESS**

**In a brief talk followed by conversation, Ervin Staub will talk about surviving the Holocaust as a child in Hungary, and how this led to his work on passive and active bystanders, the roots of genocide and its prevention, and specifically his work in Rwanda on reconciliation after the genocide and the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.**

Ervin Staub is Professor Emeritus and Founding Director of the doctoral program in the Psychology of Peace and Violence at the University of Massachusetts at Amherst. His latest award winning book, published in 2011, is *Overcoming Evil: Genocide, Violent Conflict and Terrorism*. His awards include life-long contributions to peace psychology, distinguished contributions to political psychology, distinguished scholarly and practical contributions to social justice.
