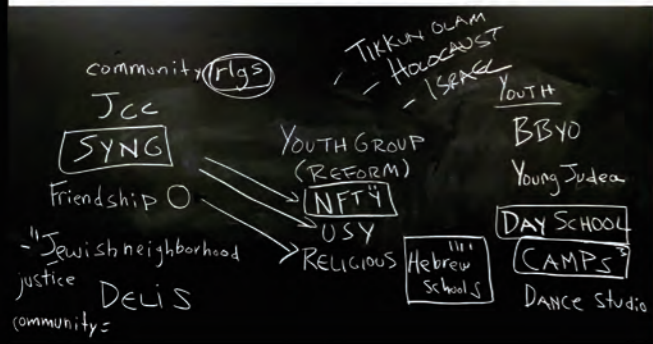
GENEROUS FUNDING IS AVAILABLE FOR ALL ADMITTED STUDENTS.

JCLP applications are considered on a rolling basis until the incoming class is filled.

Earn the **Master of Social Work** degree and a **Certificate in Jewish Communal Leadership** at the University of Michigan—home to the nation's #1-ranked School of Social Work and the Frankel Center for Judaic Studies.

- Join a small student cohort and work closely with dynamic local communities for five semesters over 20 months.
- Pursue regional, national, or international field placements with change-making agencies.
- Generate public programs to incubate your own ideas.
- Take advantage of opportunities offered by the University of Michigan and the Detroit area to focus on community building, urban engagement, and Arab-Jewish dialogue.



PROGRAM FUNDING

Michigan residents receive a minimum of \$23,500 and non-Michigan residents a minimum of \$47,000 in tuition support. Most students also receive additional merit and need-based aid.
