We find ourselves at a deeply troubling point in our history where anti-Semitism, racism and all forms of bigotry have infected our mainstream social discourse. Acts of hate motivated by anti-Semitism have been rising in recent years from swastikas defacing property, to displays of Nazi flags, to the horrific shooting at a Pittsburgh synagogue, the Tree of Life Congregation.

A panel of faculty from across campus will highlight the particularities of rising anti-Semitism and link it to broader challenges of minority groups in the America at the present moment.

This Teach-in will provide the context we need to understand the world around us and the importance of fostering a climate of tolerance and inclusion on our campus.
